Courtney Hendrickson is a graduate of the University of South Florida, and holds a Bachelors Degree in Social Work.

Courtney has been with The Haven of RCS since 2004 and is involved with numerous systems responsible for assisting individuals affected by domestic violence, including the courts, law enforcement, human services, child protection, and emergency response programs.

In her current position with The Haven, Courtney is responsible for all of the outreach and legal advocacy programs that reach over 10,000 survivors and children a year. She educates and trains various professionals and the general community on issues related to domestic violence.

Prior to being the Outreach Manager, Courtney was part of the Emergency Response Team and provided in home crisis intervention for families dealing with Domestic Violence as well as Mental Health, Substance Abuse and Child Behavior issues.

Courtney serves as member of the Pinellas County Domestic Violence Task Force and represents The Haven in multiple partnership programs including the Safe Start Partnership and the Abuse, Neglect and Dependency Committee.

Dr. William F. Robinson received his B.A. from the University of South Florida and graduated Cum Laude from the University of Tennessee College of Dentistry, where he was elected by the faculty to Omicron Kappa Upsilon and the RD Dean Honorary Odontological Society.

He is a Fellow of the American College of Dentists, the Pierre Fauchard Academy and a Fellow of the International College of Dentists. Dr. Robinson served two terms on the Florida Board of Dentistry where he served as Chairman of the Board. He was Deputy Regent of the International College of Dentists for more than eight years.

As past Chairman of the Probable Cause Panel of the Florida Board of Dentistry he has reviewed more than 10,000 cases involving malpractice or other law violations. Dr. Robinson has participated in every Licensure Exam in Florida since 1979, and is presently Chief Assistant Examiner Supervisor for the Florida Board of Health. He served as in-house Expert for A.C.H.A. for over a year.

At the present time, Dr. Robinson is looking forward to a four year term on the ADA Council on Dental Education and Licensure starting in the fall of 2009, representing the American Association of Dental Examiners.
